Cattlemen vote in new president

Rohan Sullivan, of Cave Creek Station near Mataranka, is the new president of the Northern Territory Cattlemen's Association.

He replaces Roy Chisholm, who retires at the conclusion of tomorrow's annual conference after a three-year term.

Mr Sullivan becomes the 10th president of the association, which is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year.

Mr Sullivan has more than 25 years' experience in the northern cattle industry in both private and public sectors.

His early years were spent growing up on a mixed farm near Adelaide River and in the stock camp on Alroy Downs.

After completing a degree in Rural Science at the University of New England, Armidale, NSW, Mr Sullivan joined the NT Department of Primary Production in 1986. He spent 16 years with the department including six years as manager of the Victoria River Research Station, Kidman Springs.

In 2002, Mr Sullivan resigned to work on the family-owned property at Mataranka. He is also part owner of Birdum Creek Station, Larrimah.

Mr Sullivan is a member of the Katherine Branch of the Northern Territory Cattlemen's Association.

He was elected today at the association's annual general meeting in Alice Springs.
