You can list your video as:

- Public – anyone can search and view
- Unlisted – anyone with the link can view (this is ideal to send us a direct link without people being able to search it)
- Private – only specific YouTube users can use it (not ideal as we are hoping to use the footage publicly)

Your video will be used to help educate people by sharing the personal stories from individuals and families who are being impacted.

How to upload a YouTube video:

1. Go to the YouTube website www.youtube.com/
2. If you have not signed up before - click 'Create Account' link at the top of the page and fill in details. Check email account to verify you are the user.
3. Click **Upload** link at the top of the YouTube homepage and sign in.
4. Click **Upload video** to browse for the video you would like to upload. Select the file and click **Open**.
5. Enter details about the video into the relevant fields. The more information you enter the easier it is for users to find your video.

Note: You can list your video as:

- Public – anyone can search and view
- Unlisted – anyone with the link can view (this is ideal to send us a direct link without people being able to search it)
- Private – only specific YouTube users can use it (not ideal as we are hoping to use the footage publicly)

6. Click **Save Changes** to save updates.
